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## **ITINERARY** (subject to change)

Wednesday, 7/22: Coming in to town early? Club members will be on-site to organize for the show and to greet early arrivals. Maps & directions will be available to help find area activities. An easel in the lobby will post contact info and itineraries to let arrivals know where we are. Around 5:00 we will have an optional gathering to have a group supper.

Thursday, 7/23: Join us for our "Thursday Ramble" leaving the Sturbridge Host Hotel at 12:30, we will travel Route 20 west to Route 148, going though the beautiful Common of Brookfield then on to Route 9. We will be going though the center of West Brookfield and Ware, and stopping (about 1:00) in Ware at Snow's Ice Cream. Those who wish to will continue to the Hardwick Winery where (at about 1:30) the staff will greet you and will open the doors to their winery so we can drive our cars into the building on a red carpet. Great photo opportunity inside & out. Once inside, we can enjoy cheese, crackers, & fruit (\$6 / person) while sampling wines for free. Those who do not go to the winery can stay at Snow's and the winery group will pick them up on the way back (about 2:30). We will then travel back to route 9, heading toward Quabbin Park and Reservoir (about 3:00). Great photo ops at Enfield Look Out and Visitor's Center. From there we will end the day at Steamy Tenders for dinner in an old train dinner car (about 5:00). The total trip is about 50 miles. We will have a schedule posted in the lobby, along with cell phone numbers in case you arrive late and want to meet up with us. We have to know if you're interested in the cheese, crackers, & fruit and / or dinner at Steamy Tenders so we can give an approximate head count. 
